This funding will be used to

- Build capacity in school learning language and vocabulary in Prep to meet reading targets in Fountas and Pinnell (F&P). Target is 85% of prep students to reach level C in 2016. Pre- and post success measures to be demonstrated through Brigance data sets. Professional support through Speech and Language Pathologist.(SLP)
- Develop guaranteed and viable curriculum which is narrow and sharp in Reading and Maths through a professional Learning Team Process (PLT) using the Pedagogical Coach.
- Resource agreed upon strategies to meet targets in reading and school readiness. Source Non-fiction language resources for school age students and pre-reading through "Headstart". NAPLAN tracking data sets to measure success for school age students in Years 3-5. A-E data and F&P tracking used to monitor growth across P-6.

Our initiatives include


- Structured reading blocks across the school using the SER model for reading success.
- Supported in-class intervention as part of reading programs Years 1-2- Levelled Literacy Intervention.
- Twice weekly "Headstart" early years program for parents and pre-prep students.
- Implement Foundation Q in Prep with support and development through SLP.
- Development of guaranteed and viable curriculum in Reading and Maths as part of PLT processes.
- Supported professional learning to implement strategies across P-6 with the Pedagogical Coach.
